

If you are building a fence or deck, planting a new garden or tree, or starting any project where you need to dig, you first need to know where your underground utilities are buried. Click Before You Dig is FREE and will keep you, your family, and your community safe.

**Click Before You Dig** at least **3 full working days** before you plan on digging.

You will receive a locate request ticket that lists all registered facility owners with utilities near your work site.

**Wait for Locates to be Completed**

Representatives from each facility owner listed on your ticket will contact you. They may advise you are clear of their facilities and can proceed with your work, visit your property to mark out their buried facilities, or schedule a time to meet you at the dig site. Wait until you have heard from **all** facility owners listed on your ticket before starting your work.

**Identify any Customer Owned Utility Lines**

Utilities like water and sewer service lines, sprinkler systems, and lines connecting buildings on a property are customer owned. Utility companies are not able to identify the locations of these lines. Ensure you know where all customer owned lines are on your property so you can avoid them when digging.

**Dig With Care**

Facility owners will provide you with written instructions about digging safely near their utilities. If you are digging within one metre on either side of the markings, or five metres from high pressure pipelines, you must carefully expose the lines with hand tools. Review the information facility owners provided to ensure you are following their guidelines when digging.
